

10:35 The representatives of the four national Native Organizations, their elders, and two elders of the Dene Nation, Peter Mountain, Sr., and Daniel Sanfere, are escorted to the podium and are seated.

Mr. Kakfwi takes his place at the monument.

The community delegates who will present gifts are escorted to their seats beside the table which will hold the gifts. The table will be situated directly in front of the Monument along the road.

Dene drummers at the foot of the podium start singing welcome song.

10:38 Episcopal Party and Welcome Party buses will separate from the Papal Motorcade at 92 Ave. They will turn right on 92 Ave. and drive to the road behind the podium. The parties descend from the buses and are escorted to their seats. The buses turn around and take up their positions for the return trip.

10:55 The Pope, accompanied by Bishop Croteau and Mr. Kakfwi, begins his walk towards the podium, greeting people along the way. (He proceeds in a clockwise fashion up one side of the walkway, then down the other and back up the centre to the podium.) Steve is one the right hand side of the Pope.

When Pope is halfway down the walkway Dene Drummers at the podium start drumming.

Pope is introduced to seven northern bishops.

> (The Pope's valet will take the gifts that the Pope receives and give them to a Core Group Representative at the back of the podium to be put into the van designated to carry the gifts to the airport.)

(As the meeting begins, Bishop Croteau will proceed along with other bishops, to the gift table at the side of the podium.)

Representatives of Native communities bring gifts to be received by the Northern Bishops on behalf of the Pope. After presentation, they return to their seating area.

Core Group Representatives will carry the gifts to the van designated to carry the gifts to the airport. Bishops return to their seats. Van leaves directly to the airport to load gifts on Papal aircraft.

The private audience with the National Representatives concludes. 12:10 The meeting of the Pope with the National Leaders concludes.

The Pope is escorted to the microphone by Stephen Kakfwi.

The Pope is welcomed to Denendeh in Dene by Daniel Sanfere and in English by Mr. Stephen Kakfwi. Mr. Kakfwi presents a gift.

- 12:15 The Pope replies to the welcome, presents a gift to Mr. Kakfwi and Daniel Sanfere and addresses the assembly.
- 12:35 The Pope is escorted from the podium by Mr. Kakfwi via a ramp at the back.

Reading from the letter of Paul to the Phil: 1:20 24

My one hope and trust is that I shall never have to admit defeat, but that now as always I shall have the courage for Christ to be glorified in my body, whether by my life or by my death. Life to me, of course, is Christ, but then death would bring me something more; but then again, if living in this body means doing work which is having good results - I do not know what I should choose. I am caught in this dilemma: I want to be gone and be with Christ, which would be very much the better, but for me to stay alive in this body is a more urgent need for your sake. Avoid anything in your everyday lives that would be unworthy of the gospel of Christ.

Proclamation of the Gospel:

Jesus spoke to his disciples this parable: "Now the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner going out at daybreak to hire workers for his vineyard. He made an agreement with the workers for one denarius a day, and sent them to his vineyard.

"Going out at about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the market place and said to them, 'You go to my vineyard too and I will give you a fair wage.' So they went. At about the sixth hour and again at about the ninth hour, he went out and did the same. "Then at about the eleventh hour he went out and found more men standing round, and he said to them, 'Why have you been standing here idle all day?' 'Because no one has hired us,' they answered. He said to them, 'You go into my vineyard too.'

"In the evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his bailiff, 'Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last arrivals and ending with the first.' So those who were hired at about the eleventh came forward and received one denarius each.

"When the first came, they expected to get more, but they too received one denarius each. They took it, but grumbled at the lad-nowner. The men who came last', they said, 'have done only one hour, and you have treated them the same as us, though we have done a heavy day's work in all the heat.'

"He answered one of them and said, 'My friend, I am not being unjust to you; did we not agree on one denarius? Take your earnings and go. I choose to pay the last-comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own? Why be envious because I am generous?' Thus the last will be first, and the first, last."

This is the gospel of the Lord.

Renewal of Baptismal Promises

Dear friends, through the paschal mystery we have been buried with Christ in baptism, so that we may rise with him to a new life. Let us renew the promises we made in baptism when we rejected Satan and his works, and promised to serve God faithfully in his holy Catholic Church.

Do you reject sin, so as to live in the freedom of God's children?

All:

I do.

The Holy Father:

Do you reject the glamor of evil, and refuse to be mastered by sin?

I do.

The Holy Father:

Do you reject Satan, father of sin and prince of darkness?

I do.

The Holy Father:

Do you believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth?

All:

I do.

The Holy Father:

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, was crucified, died and was buried, rose from the dead, and is now seated at the right hand of the Father?

All:

I do.

The Holy Father:

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting?

All:

I do.

The Holy Father:

God, the all-powerful Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, has given us a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and forgiven all our sins.

May he also keep us faithful to our Lord Jesus Christ for ever and ever.


As he takes the body of Christ, the Holy Father says quietly: May the body of Christ bring me to everlasting life.
